- Licensing: Enterprise CAL, CEO Communications, Collaboration Express

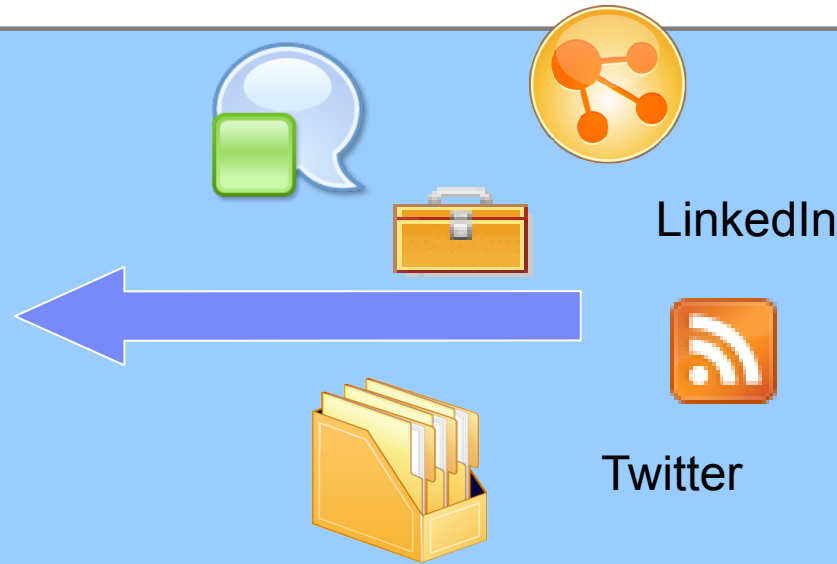
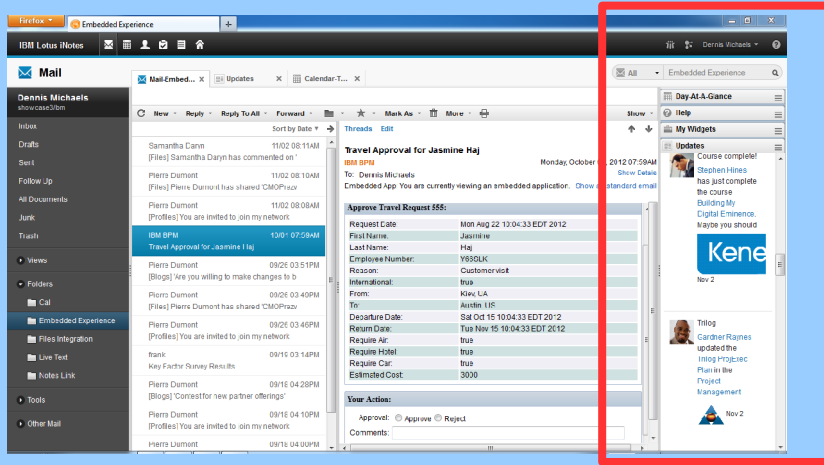
